The community has put their best ideas forward for this years trust fund vote! A total of nine proposals were submitted and all were reviewed and approved to be put forward to the community vote by Chief and Council. Council would like to sincerely thank all those individuals who took the time and effort to develop the proposals for this years vote.

Inside this issue please find the detailed breakdown of each of the proposals as submitted by their writers. These are the proposals that will be voted on, please take the time to familiarize yourself on the benefits of each program.

The Community Trust vote is being held in accordance with the Trust Agreement that was included in the claim settlement that our community voted YES to in March of 2010.

Approval of proposals is based on your vote so be sure to come out to the voting stations in the Peerless sub-office or the Trout community hall on July 17th 2014. The proposals with the highest number of YES votes will be funded based on the available funds. Council thanks everyone in advance for their participation in this process and for their vote!

### Proposal A

### **Program:** Cemetery Housing Renovation

\$14,300

**Purpose:** Is to fix up the little houses at the cemetery and other graves sites inside the nation's boundary

Duration: On-going/ Multi-year

Start as soon as possible and have 10 completed in each community this year. Consent would be provided by families of the graves being restored. Map of graves to be prepared and posted on-site.

## Proposal B Program: Escorts to accompany Members 65+ on medical trips



**Purpose:** Intended for PTFN members and founding members who are 65 years or older requiring escorts for city medical trips, appointments and non-funded meds/supplies. Allows the escort wages for taking their time to provide this service as well as personal items needed. Medicines

**Duration:** Start in 2014 to 2015? Preferred multi year/ON-GOING

### Proposal C Program: Homemaker (for elders or disabled)

## **Proposal D Program:** Housing minor renovations

\$80,000

**Purpose:** Develop a Renovation Loan Program for PTFN members by taking \$80,000/year for the next 5 years to build a \$400,000 Revolving Fund to provide financial support to members for minor home renovations (less than \$10,000/household). This would provide a long term and sustainable program to support members with repairs and improvements to their homes.

Duration: 5 year program running from 2014 to 2018

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Purpose: this ongoing program is intended to help families experiencing a medical emergency involving a member of their family who is in either the intensive care unit or palliative care. The current program allows for four medical emergencies (\$1000/emergency) involving a family member each year. This proposal allows for an additional **SIX** emergencies per year.

### **PROPOSAL I**

### **Program:** WinCard (Student Attendance Improvement)



**Purpose**: An attendance incentive program to be deem their point's bi-monthly or save them implemented in the schools in Peerless and Trout. Students will earn points for attendance, which they may choose to spend on prizes. Increased attendance should increase grade percentages.

**Duration:** Multi-year (on-going)

Budget=\$20,000

WINcard is an attendance incentive program designed to reward every student for weekly perfect attendance. 10 points will be given each week of perfect attendance. Every 4 weeks of consecutive perfect attendance a bonus 10 points will be earned. Students will be given an opportunity to retowards earning bigger prizes.

Academics (The more a student is in school the more likely their grades will go up)

Goal Setting (Students will have the opportunity to set own personal goal towards what they want)

Responsibility (Students will learn to be responsible for own success and points earned)

Decision Making (Students will have to make own decision to spend or save points)

Choices (Students will have their own personal choice of what item/s they will 'buy')

**FAO**: Question – Who can vote? **Answer** – PTFN members who are 18 or older. Remember your I.D. when you

Question - How many members need to

vote YES for a proposal to be considered? Answer - A simple majority of members must vote YES for a proposal to be considered. So if 100 members cast a ballot, at least 51 members must vote YES.

Question - Of the proposals that get a simple majority, how does the Vote then determine which proposals get funded? Answer - The proposal or proposals that are supported by a majority of the members and they have the highest number of YES votes.

**Question** – Can we vote YES for more than one proposal? **Answer** – Yes,

we have \$86,175 of net income for this years program and left over cash flow from previous years to accommodate programs voted in.

Question – What if there is a tie in the Vote for the most popular programs or services? Answer - Council will break the tie by determining which program or service offers the greatest benefit to the community.

**Question** – What if none of the proposals receive a simple majority during the vote? Answer - The funds stay in our Trust account and, under the terms of the Trust, Council may decide to call another vote.

Question – I noticed that many of the proposals are multi-year, what does this mean? Answer - These proposals are ongoing, so these they will be funded each year.
